


## Letter from Chair of Governors

Thank you for visiting the **Copenhagen Primary School** website.

I am the Chair of Federated Governing Body for both Elizabeth Garrett Anderson School and Copenhagen Primary School. The two schools work together as part of a Federation and the Governing Body oversees and supports Jo Dibb, the Executive Head, the Head Teachers and all the teachers, support staff and children at both schools.

I was elected as Chair in September 2016 and will hold this position for 4 years. I am supported on the Governing Body by Colum Elliott-Kelly, the Vice Chair, and the Chairs of 4 Committees as well as representatives from each school and 14 other Governors.



There are 5 different categories of Governor. At the moment, we have a mix of:

- 2 Elected Parent Governors (1 from EGA, 1 from CPS)
- 1 Local Authority Governor
- 2 Staff Governors (1 from EGA, 1 from CPS)
- 1 Executive Head Teacher (EGA)
- 1 Head Teacher (CPS)
- 14 Co-Opted Governors (including 5 additional parent governors and 2 additional staff governors)
- 2 Associate Governors

The Governors come from a wide range of backgrounds and have many different skills and diverse experience. Our role is to set the strategic direction for both schools and ensure that EGA and CPS provide an outstanding education in a safe and secure setting for all the students. We work together in the best interests of both schools and we are guided by a formal Code of Practice.
